The Blue Justice Community

By allowing relevant government officers in your country to connect to the secure Blue Justice Community, they will have access to **three key services** to assist government efforts to address fisheries crime: **knowledge, connection and support.**

Services

Knowledge

- Access to **learning videos** and **key resources** on aspects of fisheries crime. These can be used during workshops, meetings and individually in your country to raise awareness
- Use of **practical exercises** to be used during workshops in facilitate a process to create awareness and to identify key areas of concern in your own country

Connection

- **Secure communication** with officers in other government agencies in your own country and in other countries around the world

Support

- **Peer-to-peer support** from experts from around the world
- **Vessel tracking assistance** from the Norwegian International Vessel Tracking Center run by the Norwegian Directorate of Fisheries and the Norwegian Coastal Administration

How?

- Users can access all three services on the Community
- **Knowledge** is accessed via the **Library Page**
- **Connection** and **support** is secured via **Project Rooms**
- Create new or join existing **Project Rooms** to facilitate cooperation on issues of joint interest
- In a project room you can:
 - Join in a **discussion** with colleagues
 - **Share information** and views with colleagues in a matter of seconds
 - **Upload** documents, videos and pictures
- Online and smart phone: access and use the platform via smartphone

Security

- Access to the Community is via **two-stage password**
- All activity is facilitated by the **UNDP**
- Moderators **maintain oversight** to ensure compliance with the user agreement

Connecting and sharing knowledge with like-minded experts globally will support **more effective responses** to addressing fisheries crime in your country.

The Blue Justice Community is developed by BarentsWatch, which serves the Norwegian Government's needs for digital inter-agency communication. The server is based in Norway, and access and security of the platform is closely monitored by BarentsWatch and UNDP. Users must sign a user agreement and access to the platform is conditional upon the conditions stated therein.
