


WORLD CAPTURE FISHERIES AND AQUACULTURE PRODUCTION
















Avg. Total Fish Production 2003-2014 (MT)





Per capita fish supply (1990 -2011)


Fish provides 16% of the animal protein intake in CARICOM




Total Fish Imports 2013(mt) ~ 70,000 mt




Categories by Quantity & Value of fish products imported in 2013

Port State Measures Agreement

- Agreement on Port State Measures to Prevent, Deter and Eliminate IUU Fishing
- Adopted by the FAO Conference in 2009
- Purpose Deter IUU fishing through the implementation of port State measures
- Harmonized port State measures,
- Enhanced regional and international cooperation to block the flow of IUU-caught fish into national and international markets
- Dominica, Guyana, St. Vincent, St Kitts,
 Barbados are parties

- ☐ Established by treaty in Feb 2002
- ☐ Headquarters in Belize City
 - Office in St. Vincent and the Grenadines
- □ 17 Member States + observers

Castries Declaration on IUU Fishing

- Main policy document
- Closer cooperation, commitment & consistency in fighting IUU Fishing
- Adopted by Ministerial Council in June 2010

ILLEGAL, UNREPORTED AND UNREGULATED (IUU) FISHING

"IUU fishing greatly disadvantages and discriminates against those fishers that act responsibly, honestly and in accordance with the terms of their fishing authorizations. This is a compelling reason why IUU fishing must be dealt with expeditiously and in a transparent manner."
